To-Do #1: Check eligibility (9-12 months ahead is suggested)

You may start getting retirement benefits as early as age 62. Benefits are determined based on your retirement age. However, Medicare eligibility and benefits start at age 65 for most people.*

* People with certain disabilities or end stage renal disease may be eligible for Medicare earlier than age 65.

To-Do #2: Research your plan options (6-10 months ahead is suggested)

Original Medicare provided by the government has two parts:



Medicare Part A: Hospital coverage

You have options for adding more coverage:



Medicare Part C, or Medicare Advantage: An all-in-one, comprehensive plan. These plans may include medical, pharmacy, dental, vision and other valuable benefits. This is much like your employer's health insurance plan and is available through **NextBlue of North Dakota**. (Not available in all counties, please call to confirm eligibility.)

臣 Medicare Part D: Prescription coverage.



Medicare Supplements or Medigap: Used to fill the gaps of Part A and B. Plans are available from **Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Dakota**.

Medicare Part B: Medical coverage

To-Do #3: Know your enrollment dates (3-8 months ahead)

Most sign up for Medicare at age 65 during their Initial Enrollment Period (IEP). Your IEP lasts 7 months—your birthday month and three months before and after.



If you haven't received an enrollment notice three months before your 65th birthday, call the Social Security Administration:

To-Do #4: Delaying retirement?

If you choose to keep working past 65 and will still have creditable coverage through your employer, you can wait to enroll in Medicare Parts A and B until you retire. Check with your HR representative. We can also explain how your coverages will or will not work together.

You can also enroll during these times:



Special Enrollment Period (SEP): If you're delaying retirement, moving to a new area or losing existing coverage, you may qualify for a special enrollment period.

Part B General Enrollment Period (GEP): Every year from Jan. 1 to Mar. 31 you can enroll in Medicare Part B. If you didn't sign up for Part A at age 65, you can also enroll in Part A.



Annual Enrollment Period (AEP): Every year from Oct. 15 to Dec. 7, you can join, switch or drop a Medicare Advantage or Part D plan.
